- I. Chairman Burke called the meeting to order and gave the statement of compliance with the notification provisions of the Freedom of Information Act. Chairman Burke welcomed everyone in attendance.
 - II. **QUORUM:**
All Commissioners were in attendance. Commissioner Mike Monaghan attended by Zoom.
 - III. Commissioner Watts gave a word of prayer.
 - IV. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES:**
July 28, 2021 – Regular Meeting Minutes
Commissioner Bush made a motion to approve the minutes as submitted. Vice Chairman Haynie seconded the motion. Commissioner Watts abstained due to his absence from the July 28th commission meeting. Commissioners Smith, Monaghan, Bush, Haynie, and Burke were in favor. Motion passed.
 - V. **BUSINESS:**
Proposed permit modification for Greenwood County Landfill.
General Manager Jeff Chapman said that he and staff recommend modifying the Greenwood County Landfill Industrial User Permit. This does not require action by the Commission. This will be submitted to DHEC and a public posting for comments will be scheduled.
 - VI. **SERVICE REPORTS:**
Commissioner Watts asked about the reference on p. 15:
“Customer said bugs are coming up out of manhole under her garage. Sprayed bug killer in manholes near her house.” He did not realize that manholes were under the garages.

Director Daniel said, that is correct. A lot of mill villages have manholes under their homes and garages.

Commissioner Watts referenced work order 6579 (page 15): "Sinkhole developing in the road. Dye tested and smoke tested sinkhole, private issue". General Manager Chapman confirmed that was discussed in a meeting earlier this morning, and the damage was caused by another utility (EletriCom), and they are to repair the damage.

No further comments or questions were made.

VII. OTHER BUSINESS:

General Manager Chapman wanted to make the Commission aware of the recent SCEC (South Carolina Environmental Conference) convention GMD's ops challenge team placed 2nd place overall with seven competitors.

General Manager Chapman wanted to make the Commission aware that both treatment plants have recently had their sanitary survey from DHEC. DHEC was very complimentary, and everything looked great at the plants. DHEC praised both staff groups at Wilson Creek and West Alexander.

General Manager Chapman wanted to remind everyone of the upcoming meetings that were listed on his memo.

VIII. EXECUTIVE SESSION TO DISCUSS THE FOLLOWING:
